Topic 1: Write about the qualities or attributes you most admire in a world leader (past or present) or your role model or models

OR

Topic 2: Describe key events and/or challenges from your life that have been life-changing or cataclysmic in bringing about certain transformational change(s) in your life, to make you the person you are today. Examples can be positive or negative (challenging) in nature.

OR

Topic 3: Explain what your three priorities for Canada would be if you were "Prime Minister of Canada"

PART C: Power Point or Newsletter

Option 1: In lieu of a CV, create a power point presentation that consists of 10-15 frames about you (your interests, family/background, personal/work/volunteer experiences, strengths of character, special skills, other). Be visually creative (add photos or other graphics)

OR

Option 2: Create a 4-5 page newsletter that features the information listed in Option 1.
